### **Mission of CollegeBound Foundation:**

The mission of the CollegeBound Foundation is to encourage and enable Baltimore City public school students to attend college.

CollegeBound came into existence in 1988 as an independent, non-profit program designed to work exclusively with city students to help them achieve a post-secondary education. The broader goal is to prepare them to be members of Baltimore's workforce and to contribute to the strengthening of the social and economic fabric of our city.

### **How does the Campaign generate funds toward CollegeBound's mission?**

The Campaign generates funds a few ways:

1. Law firms in Baltimore and the surrounding area sponsor the Annual Lawyers' Campaign for CollegeBound.
2. Individual attorneys, paralegals, legal secretaries, and other support staff donate personally to the Campaign. Both of these efforts are sustained through the dedication of our volunteers, called Deans.
3. We host an annual event for summer associates each July. *'Have a Seat at the Bar!'* is a fun happy hour designed to both raise funds and awareness among soon-to-be lawyers, young lawyers, and their mentors.
